It is an early childhood comprehensive curriculum that used familiar children's literature to provide a foundation in functional skills. The units include activities that provide explicit instruction in speech/language, cognitive, gross motor, fine motor, daily living, and social skills. The Read It Once Again units are based on Michigan Early Childhood Standards for Pre-kindergarten.

Equals Math is a standards-based mathematics curriculum used in the programs for students with severe multiple impairments ages 7-15. It encompasses pre-readiness math skills such as attending to instruction, cause and effect, and everyday patterns. It also addresses foundational math skills and concepts such as numbers and operations, measurement, data analysis and probability, algebra, and geometry. Problem solving is at the core of every lesson.

Meville to WEville is a literacy program aligned with state standards that is used in the programs for students with severe multiple impairments ages 7-15. MEville ro WEville connects literacy skills with the students' real world experiences and what they know: themselves (ME), their families (MY FAMILY), and their school (MY SCHOOL). The students learn concept of print skills and vocabulary while gaining experience with fundamental literacy skills.
