		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Parent defined (American BAR Assoc definition): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Genetic mother/father</li> <li>○ Legally recognized parents</li> <li>○ Deemed on birth certificates or marital status upon birth</li> <li>○ Adoptive Parents</li> </ul> </li> <li>● Parent for purposes of school: 34 CFR 300.519 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Biological legal adoptive</li> <li>○ Guardians (</li> <li>○ Foster</li> <li>○ Individual acting as parent (power of attorney)</li> <li>○ Appointed surrogate parent</li> <li>○ Judicial degree trumps all</li> <li>○ Luke Skywalker's Parent(s) example</li> </ul> </li> <li>● The Agencies: Defined and Roles 34 CFR 300.519 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ State Edu Agency (MDE OSE)</li> <li>○ Local Educational Agency (LEA)</li> <li>○ Deaf/Blind School</li> <li>○ Juv Justice or Corectionslal</li> <li>○ Dept of Mental Health</li> <li>○ Dept of Human Services <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ 1)Public agencies are to ensure the rights of the child and if there is indeed NO PRESUMED parent. And confirm a ward of the state, harmless and/or unaccompanied minor student.</li> <li>■ 2)Each ISD must keep an appointed maintained training and retention plan along w/ a roster of surrogate parents</li> <li>■ 3)Are directed to make multiple, different, reasonable,</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> </ul>
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documented attempts to locate a parent. And the appoint a "parent" (school or court)

- 4)Ensure FERPA

- Agency Timelines 30 days to find or appoint a parent
- Parent Unresponsive: If a parent could be found/identified – And they don't respond, show up, or refuse to participate (anyone can request a surrogate be assigned to a student)
- Becoming a surrogate:
  - Almost anyone can be one
  - Exceptions:
    - Those with a conflict of interest
    - Childcaring institution staff including
    - The attending school/district personnel
    - MDHHS
    - Foster Care Agency
    - Other State Agency of Direct Interest
  - However: Surrogate parents CAN BE shelter, emergency response, independent living program staff, street outreach staff, transitional program staff that are not part of the school or state/ward agency
- Training Surrogate Parenting
  - After a surrogate is appointed by the school or a Judge:
    - Dev'l & educ'l needs of children
    - Educ'l rights of children having disabilities
  - Transitional Services (14 yrs & up)
    - Special edu statutes & rules, procedures, safeguards, and access to educ'l materials
    - DHS policy relating to to treatment, security and related
